ROYAL VICTORIA PLACE CHANGING TIMES

A new chapter is beginning for Royal Victoria Place, and your input is important.

Parts of the centre are underused, and we're exploring how they could be reimagined for modern retail, town centre living, community, and leisure



What is happening?

Royal Victoria Place is under new local ownership, following Tunbridge Wells Borough Council purchasing the centre in October 2023.

There is now a unique opportunity to rethink how this key space serves the town and wider area, and ideas are being gathered to inform future decisions and ensure the centre plays a valuable role for years to com

Changing times - an opportunity for more

Parts of the shopping centre are vacant, such as the food court. Or, like Ely Court and Market Square, they are underutilised or no longer suitable for modern retail requirements and modern consumer trends. As a result, we are exploring new activities and alternative uses for these spaces as well as opportunities to relocate existing tenants to busier and more appropriate locations.

These changes aim to unlock redevelopment potential, support the local economy, deliver community benefit and new town centre living, whilst safeguarding the Council's investment.

Progress so far

- 1992 Royal Victoria Place opens to the public
- Oct 2023 Tunbridge Wells Borough Council purchases the centre
- Jan 2024 Social media survey to understand what future brands and uses under 35's would like to see in the future
- Mid 2024 Responding to feedback, Primark is secured for the centre, alongside other new brands. Investment is directed towards events and marketing to enhance the centre's vitality and vibrancy
- End of 2024 RivingtonHark appointed to undertake a feasibility study to understand future options for redundant and underused space in the centre. Major refurbishment of Royal Victoria Place car park is approved
- Now (Spring 2025) Public opinion sought as part of feasibility study
